
# **UNCT-SWAP Gender Equality Scorecard Results Cameroon - 2018**



## **UNCT Performance by Indicator**

2018 marked the first year of UNCT reporting against the updated SWAP Scorecard. The scorecard is an accountability framework that promotes improved UNCT planning, coordination, programming and results for gender equality and the empowerment of women at country level, with the aim of supporting Member States to achieve the SDGs. The number of UNCTs who meet or exceed requirements in at least half of the performance indicators is monitored as part of the QCPR reporting.







1.Global data is comprised of a baseline assessment of 24 UNCTs that implemented the updated SWAP Scorecard methodology between 2017-2018 - Global average is calculated by the summation of total scores per indicator, divided by 24. The final version of the SWAP Scorecard includes 15 indicators. The pilot version of the tool included 18 indicators. To allow for global comparisons, adjustments were made as follows: a) two indicators related to M&E were combined into a single indicator; b) two indicators related to gender coordination were combined into a single indicator.
