# Background

The United Nations Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF) for Sudan has been set out as the strategic focus of the UN's collaboration with the Government of Sudan from 2018 to 2021 (extended to 2023). The UNDAF 2018 - 2021 has been focusing on upstream work and is aligned to both the medium- and long-term National Development Plans of the country. The theory of change that underpinned the design of UNDAF was based on the logic that good governance is a pre-condition for the realization of quality human capital, which in turn is the driver for sustainable and inclusive economic development.

Sudan has realized positive strides in the implementation of the United Nations General Assembly Resolution A/RES/72/279 on repositioning the United Nations development system to deliver on the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals. The new dispensation of the United Nations Reform has come with major changes in the roles and responsibilities for the United Nations and partners.

The current UNDAF for Sudan is extended to end on 31st December 2023 and thus, the UN Country team will commence the planning processes to formulate the new UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) for the period of 2023 -2026. The review of the current UNDAF cycle is planned to ensure accountability of the UN agencies for collective results and visibility of key achievements as well as inform on-going programming of the new Cooperation Framework.

# Specific Objectives:

- Cover the UNDAF implementation period of January 2018 to September 2022.
- Involve an analysis of the UNDAF results groups, including outcomes, outputs and the indicators as contained in the results framework.
- Analyze the Common Budgetary Framework ascertain the total resource mobilized for the implementation of UNDAF, including the core and non-core resources, by agency and per results group.
- Take stock of the transformative results achieved during the five years of implementation.
- Will form the UN Sudan (2018 2022) achievements One UN Country Results Report in close consultation with UN inter-agency groups.
- Assess effectiveness of, Human Rights Based and Gender Mainstreaming Approaches, Results Based Management and Environmental Sustainability in UNDAF implementation.

# Duties and Responsibilities of the Consultant(s):

- Desk review of the UN system analytical materials, annual reports, reviews, and UNCT and agency level Mid -Term Reports within all Results Groups; evaluations, reviews and reports of the UN joint programmes and UN Theme Groups.

- Develop an Inception Report, incorporating a methodology, timeframe of the review process.
- Produce minutes of the consultation meetings.
- Producing the review report.
- In coordination with UN IMEL Team and the RCO, conduct review on implementation of programmatic and institutional areas within UNDAF and develop strategic recommendations.
- Producing draft inputs for the UNDAF review report.
