[Mauritius/ 8 February 2023]

- 1) United Nations Country Team (UNCT) in Country Mauritius welcomes the final independent evaluation of the Strategic Partnership Framework 2019 2023.
- 2) As the evaluation pointed out, UNCT is facing the challenge of weaken focus, as most UN Agencies were thinly spread across the 6 outcomes. As such, we are pleased to report that, at the time of drafting the Management Response Plan, the design of the next Cooperation Framework has reached an advance stage. Several consultations have been held with the government and the next CF will contain only 3 Outcomes and 8 Outputs.
